RE: Leadership Meeting at SAC Museum

Sara,

Below are my notes on the 'asks' that each component expressed at the end of the meeting.

Lincoln

- 1. A clear understanding of the State Board structure including 2 members from Lincoln with at least one member on the Executive Committee, with rotating leadership on the Board.
- 2. Control of current money and control of future money that is allocated to Lincoln by the Board.
- 3. Maintain current programming.
- 4. Ability to secure sponsors for various activities and have that sponsorship money allocated to Lincoln.
- 5. Write a new set of rules and regulations.
- 6. Have leaders for Lincoln attend AIA National leadership events.
- 7. No staff is required
- 8. Partner with AIA NE on continuing education opportunities.

West

1. Similar to Lincoln but with less representation on the State Board, as long as there is representation.

Omaha

- 1. Full autonomy concerning current Omaha money and on future money allocated to Omaha by the State Board.
- 2. Funds allocated to Omaha is based on a percentage of Omaha members vs the number of members in entire state.
- 3. Representation on the board based on Omaha's percentage of members vs the number of members in the entire state.
- 4. Addition of a part time staff member located in Omaha, paid for by AIA NE
- 5. Write a new set of rules and regulations.

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6. Ability to send Omaha members to AIA National leadership events at a rate similar to what exists today.
